Activity Description in Nutshell:

The camp members embarked on a collective endeavor to enhance their surroundings by not only cleaning the area but also establishing vermicomposting beds. Constructing six sizable beds capable of yielding approximately 1.5 tons of manure each was their ambitious goal. Over the course of two days, with dedicated effort spanning five hours daily, they diligently filled the beds with a combination of dried leaves, earthworms, and cow dung. The process of building vermicomposting beds involves careful layering and management to facilitate the decomposition and conversion of organic matter into nutrient-rich compost. The dried leaves provide a carbon source, while the cow dung acts as a nitrogen-rich component, essential for the earthworms' digestion process. Together, these elements undergo decomposition, facilitated by the earthworms, which break down the organic matter and transform it into nutrient-dense compost suitable for enriching soil fertility.
